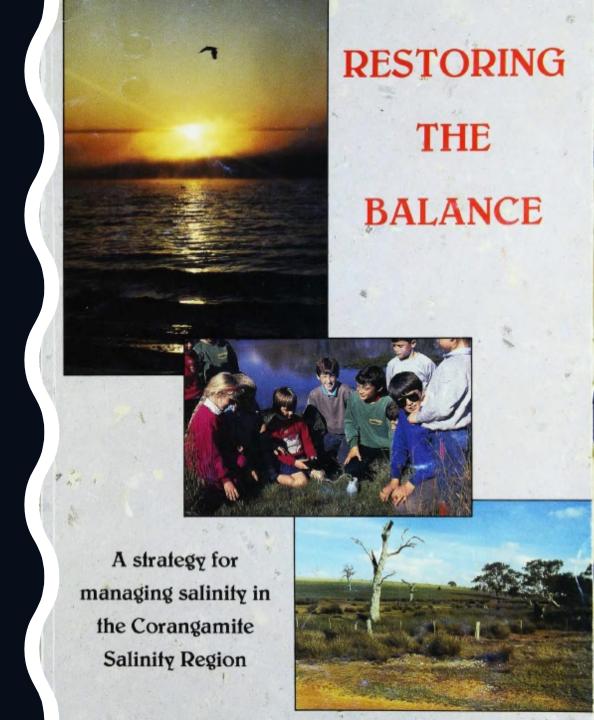

1. Make sure everyone is on the same page



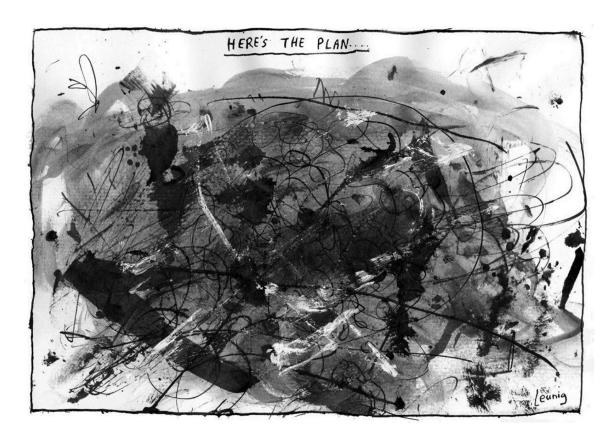
 All genuinely working on the same objectives and outcomes Traps – inclusions because of money, reputation, entitlement, looks good on an application (cull the hangers on)



2. Plan early and plan well



 Down to the activity level, made obvious for all to see / discuss



2. Plan early and plan well

 Traps – inconsistent costing for same task, no collective agreement, over promise



 Include 'hidden costs' – MEL, comms, management, admin Discuss and agree on the data capture and reporting early on

3. Have a rigorous discussion about in kind



Cam's principles of in kind inclusion

- 1. It should be **fair** Same contribution = same value
- 2. It should be **reasonable** meets the 'market'
- 3. It **directly contributes** to achieving the outcome describable link to outcome.

3. Have a rigorous discussion about in kind

What is legitimate in kind?

- Personnel directly involved in project and back room delivery same cash rate
- Your **memberships / contacts** crucial for extension (multiplier effect)
- Your **communication platforms** it is sophisticated, established and trusted
- Infrastructure / IP Often difficult if not trials but needs to be considered

Target audience attendance – project delivery V attend to learn.

4. Identify a project leader



- Expect this role to be
 - Much more work than you ever thought
 - Frustrating
 - o Repetitive.
- Be prepared to be tough at times (within we agreed to) to funders (push back on project creep)
- Invite situational leadership

In summary

- Collaborations can be anywhere between hugely rewarding (and influential) to absolute dogs.
- Your preparation will largely determine what you get
- Be honest
- Be transparent
