

### The National Soils Advocate


## Hon. Penny Wensley





- The National Soils Advocate position was established in late 2012 to raise awareness of the vital role soils play and to provide strong leadership and advocacy on the importance of conserving and improving the health of Australia's soils.
- The late Major General the Hon. Michael Jeffery AC AO (Mil) CVO MC (Retd), was the first Nationals Soil Advocate and occupied the role from 2012–17 and again in 2019.
- The Hon. Penny Wensley was appointed as the new National Soils Advocate on 28 August 2020.

## National Soil Package / Implementation

- National Soil Strategy (2021) was developed in collaboration by the Australian Government, state and territory governments, the National Soils Advocate and soil community.
- Commonwealth Interim Action Plan outlines high-level actions and their interactions with programs such as the Agriculture Stewardship Package, the Emissions Reduction Fund and the Future Drought Fund.
- Commonwealth Interim Action Plan will be replaced by the National Soil Action Plan, which is currently under development.










